President's Report

To our Members and Families,

Unprecedented!... A word that 12 months ago you would barely hear in day to day conversation, but a word that has come to define the times we have lived through in 2020. With the Club entering its 27th year of community football in the area, it was important to continue to build on the hard work of all those members and volunteers of the past 27 years in maintaining QDJFC as one of the biggest and certainly one of the best Junior Football Clubs in Perth's northern suburbs.

Pre-season had barely got underway when word came from the WAFC that all football activities were to cease due to the outbreak of Covid-19 and would be postponed until the end of May.

Registrations and team nominations were still ongoing, and work still went on behind the scenes to prepare ourselves for when footy would make a comeback. Safety Plans were drawn up, financial assessments were submitted to the WAFC, online meetings with other clubs and the WAFC were held and untold manhours were spent keeping up to date with all the requirements that were being put on community sporting groups from governing bodies and local governments alike. Online hygiene courses were compulsory for coaches, managers, committee etc, gallons of hand sanitiser and thousands of anti-bacterial wipes had to be purchased and all this was completed ready for the eventual resumption of training in June.

This disruption to the start of the season meant that we missed out on two annual events that are held dear to the Club; the Attwood/Greco Cup, which is played in memory of Gavin Attwood (Foundation Member & Life Member of QDAFC) and Nathan Greco (Past President and Life Member of QDJFC), and the Nathan Greco Cup with Wanneroo JFC, where teams from Year 7 to Year 12 were due to compete against their respective Wanneroo counterparts. Also, with the eventual format of the season not allowing for any mid-season breaks, we also missed out on our annual Emma King & Dave Burton Cups normally held during the school holidays. Let's hope we can resume these three great events for Season 2021!

We started the season with approx. 150 players spread across the 3 levels of Auskick, and around 580 players in 28 registered teams in the home and away competitions. This was made up of 14 Junior teams including 1 all-female teams playing in the West Perth Junior Football League and 14 Youth teams including 3 all-female team competing in the Northern Conference along with teams from the Subiaco and Claremont Districts. A great increase in female participation this year saw us doubling our number of all female teams from 2 to 4! Hopefully this trend continues in the years ahead.

None of the above-mentioned teams could have played each week without the efforts of a volunteer Coach and Manager. A huge thank you to everyone who filled these positions for our teams, you have contributed to the growth and development of our children while teaching them to play the game we all love. Thanks also to all the other volunteers who filled the match day roles each week, whether as a parent umpire, runner or first-aider, boundary or goal umpire... again, our kids cannot play each week without someone filling these roles so thank you to all that stepped up when asked.

When the season finally got under way, our Auskick centre opened with all age groups taking part in the new Auskick Program. Backed by the WAFC and AFL, this program seeks to increase fundamental

movement and footy skills while increasing the level of fun for the kids. Our Auskick team of Cathy & Bec done a great job overseeing the club's Auskick centre this year, and were supported over the season by Paige, Hannah and others... thanks to you all for your efforts.

Our Junior and Youth teams had a great season as new friendships were formed and old ones re-acquainted... in our Youth teams we were lucky enough to have 4 teams qualify for Grand Finals this year, an outstanding achievement considering Grand Finals meant a top 2 finish on the ladder. Congratulations to all players, parents and coaches involved with our Year 7 Lightning, Year 7-8 Tsunamis and Year 9 Thunder who made it to the big dance, and special congratulations to all those involved with our 18s Bulls who brought home the Premiership flag!

Congratulations to all players that were chosen to be a part of the West Perth Development Squads and West Perth Colts this year, keep training hard and developing those skills. Congratulations also to all our award winners, both within the club and externally in the Northern Conference Player, Umpire and Volunteer Excellence Awards.

Finally, a huge thank you must go to the hard-working members of our club Committee, some having their first years' experience of committee life and some returning having already committed multiple years of service. On behalf of all the members of our Club, thanks to each and every one of you for the effort you all put in this year, it takes a lot of work to run a club of our size and you should be proud of all that was achieved in this difficult year.

On a personal note, it's with a tinge of sadness that I have decided that this year will be my last as President of our great club, it's been an honour to continue in the footsteps of some great names in our club and something I will look back on fondly for many years to come. Thank you for the support each of you gave me in the role again this year, it was very much appreciated.

I have no doubt that the club will be in good hands moving forward, so have a great summer, and we'll see you again to "Run with the Bulls" in 2021!!

Secretary's Report

It goes without saying that 2020 has been an unusual and difficult year for everyone in all facets of life, not limited to the significant impact it had on our football season. In accordance with State and Local Government instructions we started the season late, and only after complying with a number of restrictions around group number limits, Covid Infection Control Training for Committee and coaches, and strict protocols around sanitising and attendance record keeping. Thankfully these restrictions were eased allowing junior footy in WA to return to an almost normal programme at training, and with only minor changes on game day. Our canteen volunteers were required to complete additional training (AHA Hygiene Training) to allow us to open our canteen. The restrictions that have not been

removed are around patron limits at venues which meant a completely different awards event at the end of the season.

Overall the incidences of graffiti, break-ins and attempted break-ins at the City of Wanneroo facilities we use were down this season, which was very pleasing. We had our usual variety of maintenance issues, and were delighted to hear we would get a new fridge in the canteen at Anthony Waring – unfortunately it was installed the day after our season ended. Carlye and the canteen team will have to wait until next year to use that 😊

There was no annual fundraiser this season, largely due to the late start to the season, and the entire 11 rounds being played without a general bye. Not a single weekend off for our volunteers made the season extremely tiring, despite there being less rounds in total. We used the function room at West Perth Football Club headquarters at Joondalup Arena for our a combined Fairest and Best vote count and Trophy presentation again this year, but had to give Team Managers the trophies and team photos to present to their teams themselves rather than at a formal Club event, due to social distancing and venue patron limits.

After 9 years as Club Secretary, the last 2 without having a child involved in the Club, I have decided that I will not be returning to the committee in 2021. I am proud of the significant contribution I have made in the administration of our footy club, which has allowed hundreds of kids to participate in the game they love every season. Policies, protocols and red tape often make the administration difficult and frustrating, but at the end of the day it is all aimed at keeping our kids safe, and the game day environment as positive as it can be. I have done everything from pick up dog poo to run a disciplinary panel. There has been hundreds of hours of work, millions of keystrokes on my laptop, a number of red pens, considerable brain strain, a few tears, and more laughs and wonderful memories than I could ever have hoped for. I was truly honoured to be awarded Life Membership last year, and equally as delighted to honour my dear friends and fellow extraordinary volunteers, Mark Clayton and Kirsty Murray, with Life Membership this season, and Tanya Couch a couple of seasons ago. I also had the privilege of pinning the Life Membership badge on the late, great Nathan Greco, and saw my son Jack, awarded Playing Life Membership after playing 154 games with our beloved club. But alas, it is the end of an era and time for some younger, fresher blood to take on the role. My very best wishes to whomever that may be. To the outgoing committee of season 2020, we have done it tough this year, but through perseverance, dedication and supporting each other, we have done ourselves and our club proud again. Take care my loves. I am honoured to have been a part of it, and honoured to call you my friends and my footy family.

Treasurer's Report

Firstly, I would like to commend everyone involved in making this COVID-19 Footy season a great success. From the kids, coaches, managers and committee, everybody pulled together, did as we were told and managed a great season. Thank you!

Club accounts were closed off as of Wednesday 30th September and finalised. They have been fully audited by Wealth Creations Accountants and their report is attached.

Financial Position

Club Account

Financial position for season 2020 showed the club with an income of \$172,814.25 (13.2% decrease on 2019) and expenses of \$149,149.51 (33.8% decrease on 2019), resulting in a yearly operating profit of \$23,664.74 compared to an operating loss of \$26,102.63 in season 2019.

The overall current available cash as at 30/09/2020 is \$149,843.53

Sponsorship

Mark did an excellent job again recruiting new sponsors and maintaining our existing ones, in what was a very strange season. Sponsorship contributed \$3181.82 to the Club. Along with our non-cash sponsors who generously continue to support us with vouchers and services. We would like to thank all our sponsors, without whose generosity the Club would not be in the position it's in today. Their help allows the Club to grow and continue to purchase new equipment to provide our kids with a fun, safe, family environment to learn about footy.

Fundraising

This year the Club did not run an annual fundraising event due to COVID-19 and the social distancing restrictions that were in place for most venues.

Kidsport

The Club received a total of \$28,051.00 from 161 members through the Kidsport Program this season.

The 2020 season brought in many changes to the competition and club due to Covid. At the end of the 2020 season, all Auskick Players were presented with a trophy, team photo and some goodies. Modified players received a trophy and a team photo. All of our Open Players were given a participation medal and a team photo as well.

Every year the Coaches are asked to choose a player from their team for the Bob Rintoul Award (Modifieds) and The West Perth Award (Opens). The Bob Rintoul and the West Perth Award is given to an individual that they believe is a great team player. That is, they may not have great football skills; however, they have great football values.

The Committee convene, review the Coaches nominations and choose who they believe is a worthy recipient. The Bob Rintoul award was presented to the player after their last game at Anthony Waring, whereas the West Perth Award was presented at our annual Club Presentation Day.

This year the Committee found it difficult once again to choose out of the nominees. The winner this year of The Bob Rintoul Award was ***Apiny Athoi of Year 5 Thunder***.

The West Perth Award this year was given to two players, ***Zac Paternostro of Year 7 Cyclones and Mischa Jezierski of Year 8 Lightning/Year 7-8 Tsunmais***. They also receive a signed Jersey from the West Perth football Club.

The winners also receive their fees paid for the following season by one of our Major Sponsors – Joondalup Trophies.

Every year, the Quinns Districts Amateur Football Club rewards a player as the Best Team Man from our Year 12 players. This year ***Noah Tonkin*** was the worthy recipient of this award.

During the season, the Managers of our Opens Rules Teams are given 3 voting slips each round. They are handed out to different voters per game;

- One is given to the Coach;
- Another is given to a parent or Committee Member, and,
- The third is given to a person on the Opposition Team. If someone from the Opposition Team is unavailable, then the third slip is given to another parent of the Quinn's Team.

The Slips are collected each week and at the end of the season the Club holds a Vote Count Night to see who is the winner of the Fairest & Best Award and who the Runner Up is. (*Please see Table below*)

The Northern Conference also has a vote count. These votes are awarded by the umpires each week for the Year 8 to the Under 18's teams. This year ***Kayde Sherwood (Year 8 Thunder)*** was the Winner and ***Bailey Thompson (Year 8 Lightning)*** was the Runner Up for the ***Year 8 Jake Waterman Division***. ***Luke Foster (Year 9 Thunder)*** was the Winner of the ***Year 9 Jake Waterman Division***. ***Toby Prunster***

(Year 10 Cyclones) was the Runner Up of the **Year 10 Jake Waterman Division**. **Byron Sherwood (Under 18's Squad)** was the Winner of the Under 18's Daniel Rich Competition.

The Club also gives a trophy called the 'Rising Star' Award. This award is decided by compiling the QDJFC and Northern Conference Fairest and Best votes. This year the award was won by **Bailey Thompson of Year 8 Lightning**. Congratulations Bailey!!

The Coaches also have a very hard decision in choosing players to receive trophies for the Most Consistent, Most Improved and The Coaches Award. Congratulations to all of the players who received such amazing honours from their Coaches. *(Please see Table below)*

The Committee consider the players nominated by the Coaches and positions are awarded based on the performance of the player throughout the year. A Captain and Vice-Captain are also selected. The Coach and Team Manager's positions are given to the winners of their respective awards at the end of the season. The team is recognised at the end of the year at the awards nights. The Players are presented with a medal, while the Coach and Team Manager are presented with plaques. The players, Coach and Manager also receive a certificate and layout of the team *(see below)*.



Auskick Coordinator's Report

What a year it has been for a season which we were unsure if it would even go ahead – but, it turned out to be a great season! Our numbers were down a little this season - I am unsure if it was due to Covid or the new Auskick program. Total registrations were as follows -
