## President's Report

To our Players, Parents and Life Members,

What a season 2021 turned out to be! With a strained and unprecedented 2020 season, we continued to do our best to carry on with the Quinns spirit well known to the club.

With the club now entering its 28<sup>th</sup> year of football within the community, we knew we had to work just as hard. As we all know, it's hard to be known as one of the best junior football clubs in the Northern Conference, but it's even harder to maintain that level of achievement.

The clubs season commenced with pre-season on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February. Due to oval availability, we had to stagger it this year to enable all year group's access for training drills etc. We focused our pre-season this year on fitness, skill development with rotating stations and mixed up the year groups to enhance their football development.

As word spread about our Pre-Season structure, registrations continued to grow. This developed into the club having 32 teams registered with the WAFC for the 2021 Season. And for the first time in **any** club's history Quinns was the first club to have 3 Under 18's teams registered and playing in the competition. The WAFC had to re-write the rules for this as no club was ever expected to accomplish this!

As usual our committee was working hard behind the scenes preparing for the year ahead as we reverted back to a 15-round season. Registrations overall exceeded the 800 mark this year! Our Auskick program had 188 registrations from PP to Year 2; Starkick continued to grow with 24 registered. Registrations for Year 3 to Year 12 were at an astonishing 662.

Our Friday Night Girls Competition has also had a great year with more girls wanting to join our club to play junior footy. Last season we had 4 teams with 74 registered, this year it increased to 6 teams and 119 registered. That's an amazing growth in girl's football and can only imagine these numbers to continue to rise.

We also joined clubs with Brighton to form a Year 10 team – Northern Falcons. The team consisted of half Quinns and half Brighton players. Players were a bit apprehensive at first. However, once their season got underway, they realised the potential the team had, with players and parents all happy with how well the team performed over the year.

Due to Covid last year we were unable to host the Nathan Greco Cup. However, with life now relatively back to normal, it was played on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> April at Anthony Waring. I am happy to report that Quinns came out on top at the end of the day winning the cup – Quinns 162 to Wanneroo 153. All year groups were allocated a trophy to be awarded to one player for Best on Ground. Congratulations to the following Quinns players:

We were also due to host the annual Emma King & Dave Burton Cups but unfortunately due to Covid cases in our area, we were forced to cancel this prestigious event.

Last year, the Committee put out a tender for designs for an Indigenous Jumper. We had quite a few submitted all with their own individual meaning. The Committee decided on Alistair and Beverley Pickett's design. I would like to thank Joe Murray our President from last year and Mark Clayton as these two were instrumental in the process.

The design is based on a place of meeting, past present and future on Noongar Land which we play on. These jumpers made their debut at the 2021 Nathan Greco Cup on Sunday 18th April to everyone's enthusiasm and appreciation.

To show our gratitude on behalf of the Committee and the Club, we presented Alistair and Beverley Pickett with a framed jumper.

We had 4 teams again this year make it to the big day – Year 7 Thunder, Year 7–8 Typhoons, Year 9 Thunder and Year 9–10 Typhoons. Congratulations to all teams involved with Year 7 Thunder and Year 9 Thunder Premiers. This is such an amazing achievement for our players as some had never played football before and our Year 9–10 Typhoons coming from 4<sup>th</sup> place beating the undefeated team of Wanneroo to make it into the Grand Final!

None of the above-mentioned teams, plus our 28 teams could have played each week without the efforts and assistance of volunteers.

Thank you to everyone who filled these positions for our teams. Whether as a parent umpire, runner or first-aider, boundary or goal umpire, interchange steward or timekeeper/scorer. Your contributions do not go unnoticed by the club.

Special thanks to the Coaches and Managers who put in a numerous amount of hours during the week and on game day. Your contributions enable the development of our players, whether it is in leadership, sportsmanship, at skills based or mentoring.

Congratulations to all players that were chosen to be a part of the West Perth Development Squads, West Perth Colts and the Rogers Cup this year. Congratulations also to all our award winners, both within the club and externally. You should be extremely proud of how well you have performed this year. On behalf of the club – Well done!

Congratulations to Travis Bostock and Jason Garland for being presented with Life Membership with the club. An amazing achievement and both well deserved to receive this prestigious award.

Thanks to Mark who took on the role of Starkick Coordinator again this year. His passion and belief that kids with disabilities need to be included playing footy at all ages. He puts in hours of work into our Starkick Program which continues to grow in numbers every year. Mark has also been nominated for the 2021 Awards of Excellence for his extraordinary efforts with the Starkick Program

A massive thank you must go to the hard-working members of our club Committee. A lot of time is taken away out of our personal lives to run a club of our numbers and diversity. Thanks to each and every one of you for the effort you all put in this year, you should be proud of all that you achieved this year.

And finally... I couldn't possibly move on without thanking just one more person.

Bruce – Thank you for your continued support, patience, listening to me vent, and many nights watching me at the computer. You could always find Bruce at Anthony Waring on a Sunday behind the BBQ cooking and making bacon and egg rolls, killing my egg and flipping burgers. ## **Treasurer's Report**

Firstly, I would like to commend everyone involved in making this Footy season a great success. From the kids, coaches, managers and committee, everybody pulled together, and we had an awesome 2021 season. Thank you!

Club accounts were closed off as of Thursday 30th September and finalised. They have been fully audited by Wealth Creations Accountants and their report is attached.

### **Financial Position**

#### **Club Account**

Financial position for season 2021 showed the club with an income of \$211,673.57 and expenses of \$222,808.77, (approximately \$15,000 carried over from season 2020) resulting in a yearly operating loss \$11,135.20.

The overall current available cash as at 30/09/2021 is \$130,388.00

### **Sponsorship**

Jason did an excellent job again recruiting new sponsors and maintaining our existing ones. Sponsorship contributed \$3092.23 to the Club. Along with our non-cash sponsors who generously continue to support us with vouchers and services. We would like to thank all our sponsors; without whose generosity the Club would not be in the position it's in today. Their

help allows the Club to grow and continue to purchase new equipment to provide our kids with a fun, safe, family environment to learn about footy.

### **Fundraising**

This year the Club did not run an annual fundraising event due to continued uncertainty around COVID-19 and the social distancing restrictions that were occasionally brought in at very short notice.

### **Kidsport**

The Club received a total of \$30,790.00 from 180 members through the Kidsport Program this season.

This year the Committee found it difficult once again to choose out of the nominees. The winner this year of The Bob Rintoul Award was Tyran Daly.

The West Perth Award this year was given to Robbie Anderson. This player also received a signed Jersey from the West Perth football Club.

The winners also receive their fees paid for the following season by one of our Major Sponsors – Joondalup Trophies.

During the season, the Managers of our Opens Rules Teams are given 3 voting slips each round. They are handed out to different voters per game;

- One is given to the Coach;
- Another is given to a parent or Committee Member, and,
- The third is given to a person on the Opposition Team. If someone from the Opposition Team is unavailable, then the third slip is given to another parent of the Quinn's Team.

The Slips are collected each week and at the end of the season the Club holds a Vote Count Night to see who is the winner of the Fairest & Best Award and who the Runner Up is. *(Please see Table below)*

The Club also gives a trophy called the 'Rising Star' Award. This award is decided by compiling the QDJFC and Northern Conference Fairest and Best votes. This year the award was won by **Lance Griessel From year 9 Lightning**. Congratulations Lance!!

The Coaches also have a very hard decision in choosing players to receive trophies for the Most Consistent, Most Improved and The Coaches Award. Congratulations to all of the players who received such amazing honours from their Coaches. *(Please see Table below)*

Every year the Club ask the Coaches of Years 7 to 12 to nominate players to make up the "Team of the Year". The positions available are:

The Committee consider the players nominated by the Coaches and positions are awarded based on the performance of the player throughout the year. A Captain and Vice-Captain are also selected. The Coach and Team Manager's positions are given to the winners of their respective awards at the end of the season. The team is recognised at the end of the year at the awards nights. The Players are presented with a medal, while the Coach and Team Manager are presented with plaques. The players, Coach and Manager also receive a certificate and layout of the team (*see below*).

A very special mention to Candice Bartlett who has been my Assistant throughout the season. Thank you for all the things you have helped me with.



## Auskick Coordinator's Report

What a year it has been! With a very unsure start if the season would go ahead on time, we were lucky enough for the entire season to go ahead and have a smooth run. We even got to participate in Mother's and Father's Day rounds, as well as Gala Day at a new location, being at Providence Oval (HBF Arena).

Our numbers have grown since the 2020 season across all 3 age groups, with majority of the growth being from new registrations. We started off with very few numbers prior to the season, however within weeks of the season commencing, numbers jumped significantly.

Due to such growth in numbers, we made the decision to make more teams of smaller numbers as it was so unpredictable when new registrations would stop flowing in. With going from 4 teams across the 3-year groups, to having 6, this allowed us to have the room for new registrations without over-filling teams. We found that this worked well as within the first couple of weeks of the season, majority of teams were at maximum number capacity. With having 6 teams in each year group, we were still able to keep to only having to set up two grids in the morning, changing the activities for each year group over whilst the teams were doing their award presentations.

As per last year, we decided at the beginning of the season that the weekly awards will be done in their own teams. We found this to be good transitional practice between going from Auskick Year 2 to Year 3 in Modified, where managers collect their paperwork prior to the Sunday and are responsible for taking care of the awards and passing on any information required. Again, following on from last year, we kept to no trophy presentation, and got the teams to hand them out individually as per mods and opens. We also separated Father's Day from Trophy Presentation Day. This worked well as it avoided any time overlap between the 3-year groups and allowed us to be able to change over the grids.

As we were lucky enough to be able to participate in 15 rounds, we followed the NAB Auskick activities roster for the compulsory 10-week program, leaving us 5 rounds to play around with. Two of these weeks were used for our Mother's and Father's Day rounds, and 1 other week being used as the Gala Day round. We then had 2 spare weeks at the end of the season where we decided would be beneficial for the Year 2's to experience what going into Modifieds would be like. We Changed the program for them to play 2 activities of 10 minutes each, and then having a game with playing 4 quarters, like they would when they go to Year 3. With changing the Year 2's we thought we would change up the other 2 age groups as well just for some fun. Pre-Primary and Year 1 played 3 activities of 10 minutes each, and then a game of 2 halves.

Thank you to all coaches and managers that volunteered for their teams this year. Without these roles filled, it makes the season a lot harder on us and we are always grateful for the time you put in. Hopefully we see you all back next season.

Thank you to Cathy Searson, Bec Bray and Tara Searson for all your help this year. Not only behind the scenes helping Facebook posts and team allocations, but for running Saturdays while I was unable to be there due to work commitments. I wouldn't have been able to run this season without the support from the 3 of you.

Thank you to the committee for all the help and support throughout the season.

After long consideration, Cathy Searson and myself have decided we will be stepping down this season. We have done this role now for a few years and have learnt so much in the process. We have thoroughly enjoyed doing the role, working alongside some amazing managers and coaches as well as other committee members, building great friendships. Although the role can be stressful at times, to see the smile on all the children's faces whilst running around and having so much fun, it makes all the hard work and effort worth every little bit of it. Thank you to everyone who gave us the opportunity to continue in our role for so long, and for all the support and guidance we have had over the years, we look forward to seeing someone else take on the role and improving Auskick in their own way.
