President's Report

To our Players, Parents and Life Members,

What a great season 2022 had been. We made history with the largest number of teams participating in the 2022 Grand Final weekend, we had five teams make the "big dance". The club went into the season with a very new looking committee, were we all had to work hard to maintain the level of excellence that this club is known for in the Northern Conference. There is always no shortage of challenges to face throughout the year our role is to get all our teams running out each weekend across the competition to represent this great club. Thank you, committee.

The club's season commenced with pre-season training on Tuesday 22nd of February. We focused on helping prepare for the upcoming season working on the basics of football skills in kicking, hand balling and marking.

This season the club had entered the Metro North competitions with 25 teams, unfortunately this was lower numbers as to 2021 were we had 32 teams registered.

For our Friday Nights Girl Competition, we had 4 teams with 94 registered, unfortunately once again we recorded lower numbers as to the previous season where we had 119 girls registered.

Our Auskick program continued to grow with 190 registrations from PP to Year 2. Our Starkick program began its fifth season in 2022, continuing to grow with 30 registrations. Thank you Mark for taking the Starkick Coordinator role again this year.

In 2022 the WAFC Metro North Team trialled a Year 7 Pre-Season Carnival which provided the opportunity for Year 7 teams to transition into Youth football. The carnival was held on Sunday, 3 April, Year 7 Thunder participated against opposition teams from outside of our District for the first time. They won their first game against Carine 49-6 and lost their second in a close contest to Kingsway 14-17.

In respects to the Greco family at their request we changed the Greco Cup back to the President's Cup. The President's Cup was hosted by Wanneroo at the Showgrounds on Sunday 24th April. Quinns won five of the eight games but unfortunately Wanneroo came out on top due to the overall points system. Treasurer's Report

Firstly, I would like to commend everyone involved in making this Footy season a great success. From the kids, coaches, managers and committee, everybody pulled together, and we had an awesome 2022 season. Thank you!

This season we were introduced to the new registration system of PlayHQ, with a few small hiccups along the way, hopefully next season registrations will run effortlessly.

Due to this new registration system, the way in which the fees were received didn't allow us to break down the fees into groups (Auskick, Youths, Juniors, Starkick etc) so it has all been added together as one amount.

Club accounts were closed off as of Thursday 30th September and finalised. They are currently being audited by Wealth Creations Accountants and their final reports will be tabled at the first committee meeting of the new season.

Financial Position

Club Account

Financial position for season 2022 showed the club with an income of \$197369.14 and expenses of \$227315.31, (approximately \$5,000 carried over from season 2021) resulting in a yearly operating loss \$29,946.17.

The overall current available cash as at 30/09/2022 is \$101,560.21

Sponsorship

Katherine did an amazing job again with our sponsors, over doubling the contributions from last season. Sponsorship contributed \$7363.64 to the Club. Along with our non-cash sponsors who generously continue to support us with vouchers and services. We would like to thank all our sponsors; without whose generosity the Club would not be in the position it's in today. Their help allows the Club to grow and continue to purchase new equipment to provide our kids with a fun, safe, family environment to learn about footy.

Fundraising

The major fundraiser for the club this season was from the Toyota Good For Footy Raffle for which the club received \$2482.23.

Kidsport

The Club received a total of \$23,000 from through the Kidsport Program this season.

This is a great result for the Kidsport Program and has hopefully allowed many kids to play sport that may not otherwise have had the opportunity.

At the end of the 2022 season, all Auskick Players were presented with a trophy, team photo and some goodies. Modified players received a trophy and a team photo. All of our Open Players were given a participation medal and a team photo as well.

Every year the Coaches are asked to choose a player from their team for the Bob Rintoul Award (Modifieds) and The West Perth Award (Opens). The Bob Rintoul and the West Perth Award is given to an individual that they believe is a great team player. That is, they may not have great football skills; however, they have great football values.

The Committee convene, review the Coaches nominations and choose who they believe is a worthy recipient. The Bob Rintoul award was presented to the player after their last game at Anthony Waring, whereas the West Perth Award was presented at our annual Club Presentation Day.

This year the winner of The Bob Rintoul Award was McKenzie Pritchard

The West Perth Award this year was given to Harry Bower. This player also received a signed Jersey from the West Perth Football Club.

The winners also receive their fees paid for the following season by one of our Major Sponsors – Joondalup Trophies.

During the season, the Managers of our Opens Rules Teams are given 3 voting slips each round. They are handed out to different voters per game;

- One is given to the Coach;
- Another is given to a parent or Committee Member, and,
- The third is given to a person on the Opposition Team. If someone from the Opposition Team is unavailable, then the third slip is given to another parent of the Quinns Team.

The Slips are collected each week and at the end of the season the Club holds a Vote Count Night to see who is the winner of the Fairest & Best Award and who the Runner Up is.

The Club also gives a trophy called the 'Rising Star' Award. This award is decided by compiling the QDJFC and Northern Conference Fairest and Best votes. This year the award was won by **Spencer Worts**. Congratulations Spencer!!

The Coaches also have a very hard decision in choosing players to receive trophies for the Most Consistent, Most Improved and The Coaches Award. Congratulations to all of the players who received such amazing honours from their Coaches. (*Please see Table below*)

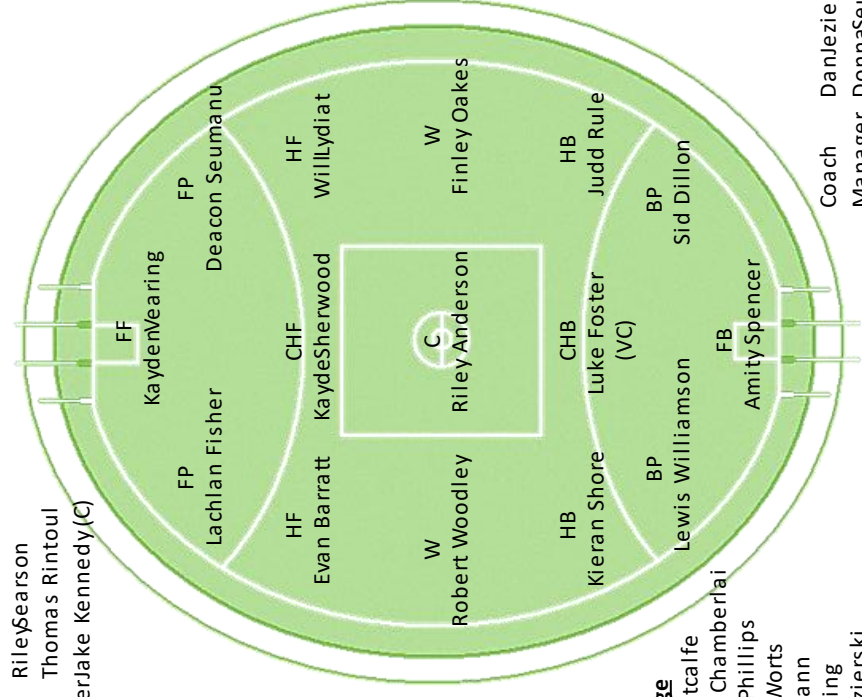

The Coach and Team Manager’s positions are given to the winners of their respective awards at the end of the season. The team is recognised at the end of the year at the awards nights. The Players are presented with a medal, while the Coach and Team Manager are presented with plaques. The players, Coach and Manager also receive a certificate and layout of the team (*see below*).

Quinns are so blessed to have these wonderful bunch of people representing the club. Thanks a million!!

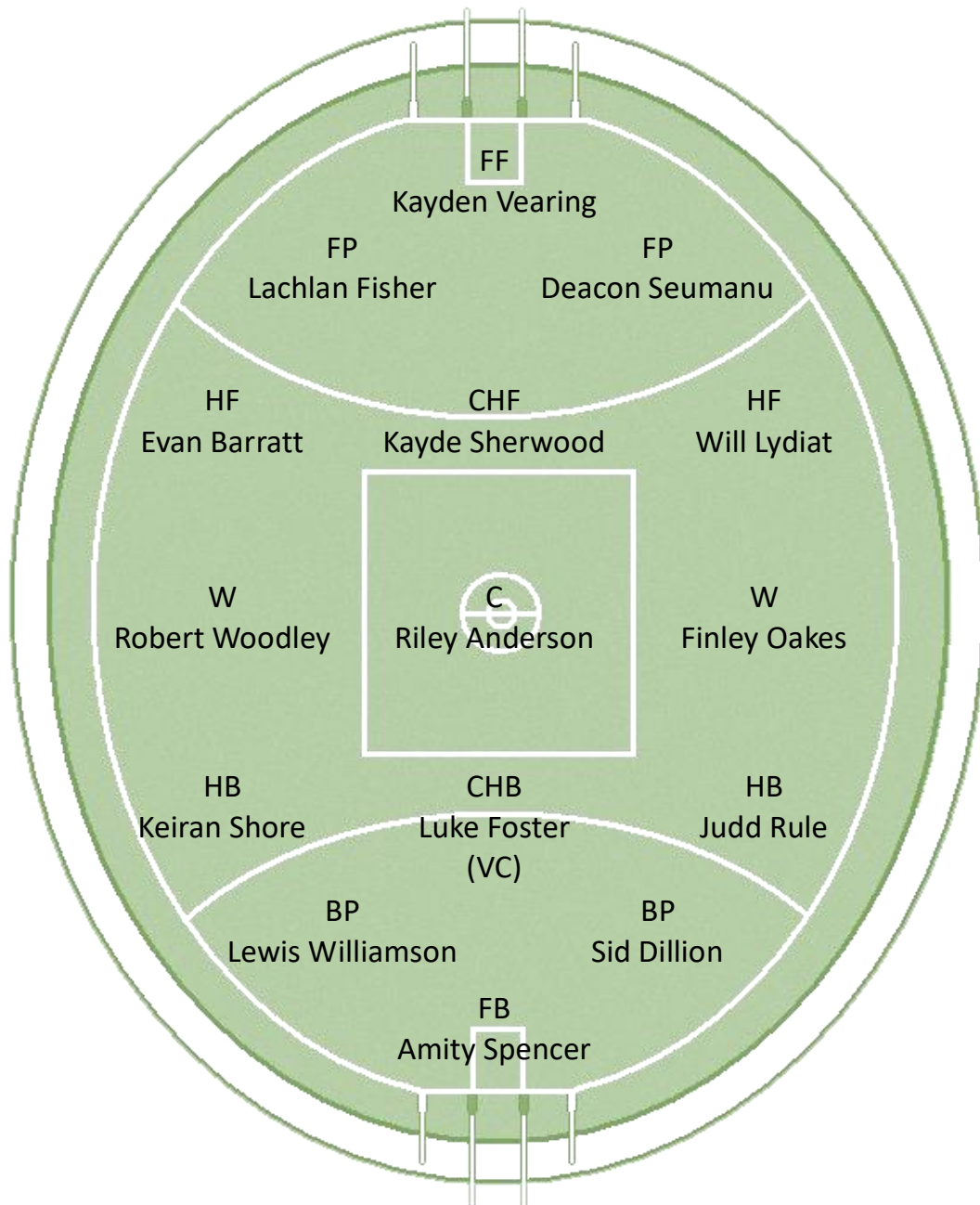

Our highest total of players for one Saturday Morning was 34 Players. This stretched our resources but proved to be a great learning curb for us all and helped us work how to manage a larger participant program.

The club held a 'Come and Try' day in round 2 which helped the Starkick Team grow again this season. With the growth of Starkick across WA I expect our numbers to double in the next few years.

With our numbers this year we continued playing two teams of Starkickers against each other in their 20-minute game. The teams continued with Starkick Red and Starkick Blue. Next Year we hope to get some club Starkick away strips to our games to move away from the Auskick Bibs and provide a more inclusive program for our players.

Our games and training sessions on Saturday mornings 9:30 to 11:00 am Parents again preferred this time slot for their children.
