President's Report

To our Players, Parents and Life Members,

Wowee! What a great season 2023 had been. The club had entered its 30th year of football within the community. The club went into the season with a familiar committee, where we all had to work hard to maintain the level of excellence that this club is known for in the Northern Conference. There is always no shortage of challenges to face throughout the year our role is to get all our teams running out each weekend across the competition to represent this great club in a safe and healthy environment. Thank you, committee your commitment and willingness in helping run this club should not go unnoticed.

The clubs season commenced with pre-season training on Tuesday the 20th of February. We focused on helping prepare for the upcoming season working on fitness and the basics of football skills in kicking, hand balling and marking, to enhance their football development.

The club had entered the 2023 Metro North competition with 26 teams, this was one team greater than the previous year.

Our Friday Nights Girls Competition had a great year with more girls wanting to join our club to play junior footy. Last year we had 4 teams with 94 registrations, this year it increased to 6 teams with 152 registered. This is the largest amount girls registered to our club since the girl's competition established in 2017. Its amazing to watch the growth in girl's football.

Our Auskick program continued to grow with 203 registrations from PP to year 2. Last year we had 190 and in 2021 188. Our Starkick program began its sixth season, unfortunately numbers were lower this season with 19 registered players, as the previous season there were 30 registrations. Thank you to Rosanna, Shane and Mark for running the Auskick and Starkick program for the 2023 season.

Due to the success from last year's Pre-season year 7 Carnival, WAFC Metro North Team ran the Year 7 Pre-Season Carnival again which provided the opportunity for Year 7 teams to transition into Youth football. The carnival was held on Sunday, 2nd April, Year 7 Storm participated against opposition teams from outside of our District for the first time.

The President's Cup was hosted by our club at Anthony Waring on Sunday 16th April. It was a tight contest throughout the day for all participating age groups. Quinns won 3 games, Wanneroo won 4 and we had the year 9's draw. Congratulations to Wanneroo for taking out the cup for the 2nd year in a row. Firstly, I would like to commend everyone involved in making this Footy season once again great success. From the kids, coaches, managers and committee, everybody pulled together, and we had an awesome 2023 season. Thank you!

This season we welcomed back Carlye to our Canteen working her magic to feed us all.

We have rebranded our Merchandise, which has been a welcomed change up.

Club accounts were closed off as of Saturday 30th September and finalised. They are currently being audited by Wealth Creations Accountants and their final reports will be tabled at the AGM.

Financial Position

Club Account

Financial position for season 2023 showed the club with an income of \$199,103.87 and expenses of \$208,444.96, resulting in a yearly operating loss \$9341.09.

The overall current available cash as at 30/09/2023 is \$88,984.65

Sponsorship

Katherine has again excelled in her roll with our sponsors, again increasing the contributions from last season. Sponsorship contributed \$9436.82 to the Club. Along with our non-cash sponsors who generously continue to support us with vouchers and services. We would like to thank all our sponsors; without whose generosity the Club would not be in the position it's in today. Their help allows the Club to grow and continue to purchase new equipment to provide our kids with a fun, safe, family environment to learn about footy.

Fundraising

The major fundraiser for the club this season was from the Toyota Good For Footy Raffle for which the club received \$1611.74.

Kidsport

The Club received a total of \$18,911 through the Kidsport Program this season.

This is a great result for the Kidsport Program and has hopefully allowed many kids to play sport that may not otherwise have had the opportunity.

At the end of the 2023 season, all Auskick players, Modified players and Open players were given a 30th anniversary participation medal and a team photo.

Every year the Coaches are asked to choose a player from their team for the Bob Rintoul Award (Modifieds) and The West Perth Award (Opens). The Bob Rintoul and the West Perth Award is given to an individual that they believe is a great team player. That is, they may not have great football skills; however, they have great football values.

The Committee convene, review the Coaches nominations and choose who they believe is a worthy recipient. The Bob Rintoul award was presented to the player after their last game at Anthony Waring, whereas the West Perth Award was presented at our annual Club Presentation Day.

This year the winner of The Bob Rintoul Award was Alexander Hyde.

The West Perth Award this year was given to Chloe Innes. This player also received a voucher from the West Perth Football Club.

The winners also receive their fees paid for the following season by one of our Major Sponsors – Joondalup Trophies.

During the season, the Managers of our Opens Rules Teams are given 3 voting slips each round. They are handed out to different voters per game;

- One is given to the Coach;
- Another is given to a parent or Committee Member, and,

- The third is given to a person on the Opposition Team. If someone from the Opposition Team is unavailable, then the third slip is given to another parent of the Quinns Team.

The Slips are collected each week and at the end of the season the Club holds a Vote Count Night to see who is the winner of the Fairest & Best Award and who the Runner Up is.

The Club also gives a trophy called the 'Rising Star' Award. This award is decided by compiling the QDJFC and Northern Conference Fairest and Best votes. This year the award was won by **Spencer Worts**. Congratulations Spencer!!

The Coaches also have a very hard decision in choosing players to receive trophies for the Most Consistent, Most Improved and The Coaches Award. Congratulations to all of the players who received such amazing honours from their Coaches. (*Please see Table below*)

Every year the Club ask the Coaches of Years 7 to 12 to nominate players to make up the "Team of the Year". The positions available are:

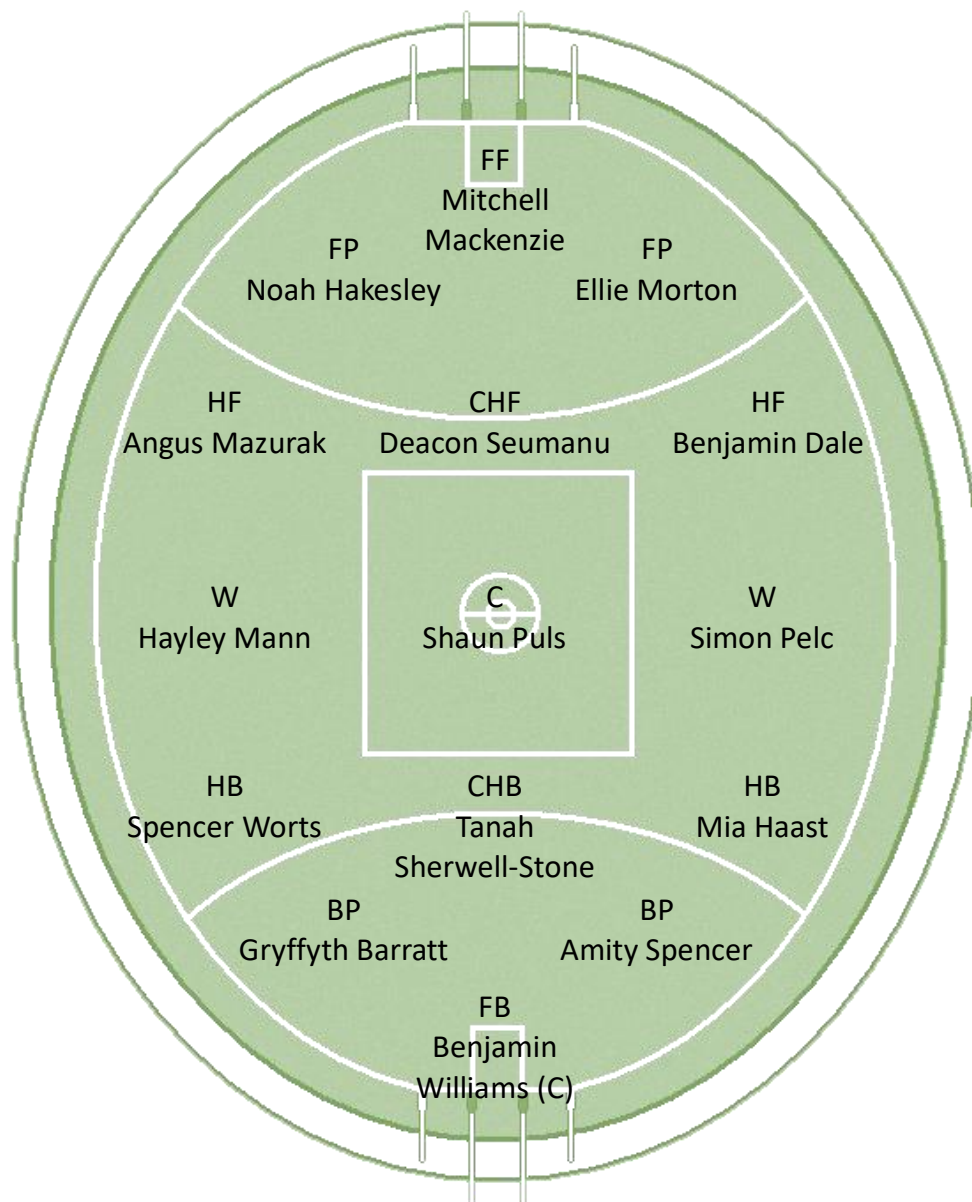
- Full Forward (1 Position)

Our Starkick All Abilities Program began its sixth season in 2023.

Starkick All Abilities Centres has grown from 4 teams when we began in 2018 to 24 Centres across Western Australia in 2023. With further expansions expected in country WA next season, the future of the Starkick program is looking positive.

The age bracket for our players was again broadened to allow more children with a disability a chance to play football at our club. This year's ages ranged from 5 to 17 years. Despite the increased age range, our playing list fell to 19 registered players from the previous 31 registered. We had 9 players who were Auskick aged.

The loss of some older aged players to other sports and players progressing into the mainstream football programs are some reasons for player loss, something next year the club needs to address is recruiting younger aged players to increase numbers through the years ahead.

Our season went on for 14 rounds and our players were involved in many cross-district events. The club held come and try days in round 2 and round 3 to try and boost numbers. We held a Mother's Day round and a Father's Day round. We also had a former QDJFC player Ronan Fitzgerald do a video presentation for his media studies about Starkick and Integrated Football. Ronan's video was a great way to promote our club and Starkick.

We attended the Fremantle gala day and the Northern Conference gala day at Cockburn and Nollamara where we played against other clubs from metro Perth. Our players enjoy these days. We also attended a Come N Try Day at Lathlain Park with the West Coast Eagles.

Our Starkick team was also part of the Inaugural Walk for Inclusion. This event had about 1000 people walk from Gloucester Park across Matagarup Bridge to Optus Stadium. Our parents were thankful to Rosanna for making our team feel inclusive.

The future looks great for Starkick with new branding, further expansion to include other clubs and further support from the WAFC and AFL.
