President's Report

To our Members and Families,

It has been yet another wonderful football season. The club had entered its 31st year of football within the community. We went into the season with a familiar committee, they are the heartbeat of this club, the drive, commitment and time they have put into our club should never be underestimated or undervalued. Thank you for all your hard work, willingness and commitment in helping maintain the level of excellence that this club is known for in the Metro North competition.

During the club's 31-year history we have been crowned with club of the year on 4 occasions. Back in the early 2000's WAFC titled the prestigious award Champion Club. The club was awarded Champion Club 2004, 2005 and 2011. In 2016 the club received Junior Club of the Year. Getting this award is the one all clubs want and it's been a while for us.

On the 12th of October at the Perth Convention Centre Ballroom, the West Australian Football Commission held the Community Football Awards. With over 1200 guests I'm proud and honored to have had the opportunity to represent Q.D.J.F.C as the recipient of Junior Club of the Year 2024. Thank you to everyone that has made it possible to win this prestigious award.

The clubs season commenced with pre-season training on the 12th of February. We focused on helping prepare for the upcoming season working on the basics of football skills in kicking, handballing and marking as well as helping players build their fitness.

The club had entered the 2024 Metro North competition with 26 teams, this was the same as last year.

Female football continues to gain momentum with increasing numbers of players throughout 2024. It was great to see a Year 3/4 team represent the club in the competition this year where before we haven't had the numbers over previous years to enter a team. We joined clubs with Ocean Ridge to form an under 18/s team playing as The Bull Sharks. We entered the Metro North competition with 5 female teams, not including The Bull Sharks. It's truly amazing to see the growth in female football throughout the competition.

Unfortunately, our numbers for the Auskick program were lower than 2023 with 156 registrations from PP to year 2. Last year we had 203 registrations. Our Starkick program began its seventh season, with 23 registered players, the previous season we had 19 registered players. Thank you to Tahlia, Declan and Mark for running the Auskick and Starkick program for the 2024 season.

I would like to congratulate Mark Clayton who was honored with the Disability Inclusion Ambassador Award for his outstanding work with Starkick.

The President's Cup was hosted by Wanneroo at the Showgrounds on Sunday 21st April. I can proudly say that the Cup has made its way home after 2 years of narrow defeats. Club accounts were closed off as of Monday 30th September and finalised. They are currently being audited by Wealth Creations Accountants and their final reports will be tabled at the AGM.

Financial Position

At the end of the 2024 season, all Auskick players, Modified players and Open players were given a participation medal and a team photo.

Every year the Coaches are asked to choose a player from their team for the Bob Rintoul Award (Modifieds) and The West Perth Award (Opens). The Bob Rintoul and the West Perth Award is given to an individual that they believe is a great team player. That is, they may not have great football skills; however, they have great football values.

The Committee convene, review the Coaches nominations and choose who they believe is a worthy recipient. The Bob Rintoul award was presented to the player after their last game at Anthony Waring, whereas the West Perth Award was presented at our annual Club Presentation Day.

This year the winner of The Bob Rintoul Award was Chace Ryan.

The West Perth Award this year was given to Oliver Schmidt. This player received a guernsey from the West Perth Football Club.

The winners also receive their fees paid for the following season by one of our Major Sponsors – Joondalup Trophies.

During the season, the Managers of our Opens Rules Teams are given 3 voting slips each round. They are handed out to different voters per game;

- One is given to the Coach;
- Another is given to a parent or Committee Member, and,
- The third is given to a person on the Opposition Team. If someone from the Opposition Team is unavailable, then the third slip is given to another parent of the Quinns Team.

The Slips are collected each week and at the end of the season the Club holds a Vote Count Night to see who the winner of the Fairest & Best Award is and who the Runner Up is.

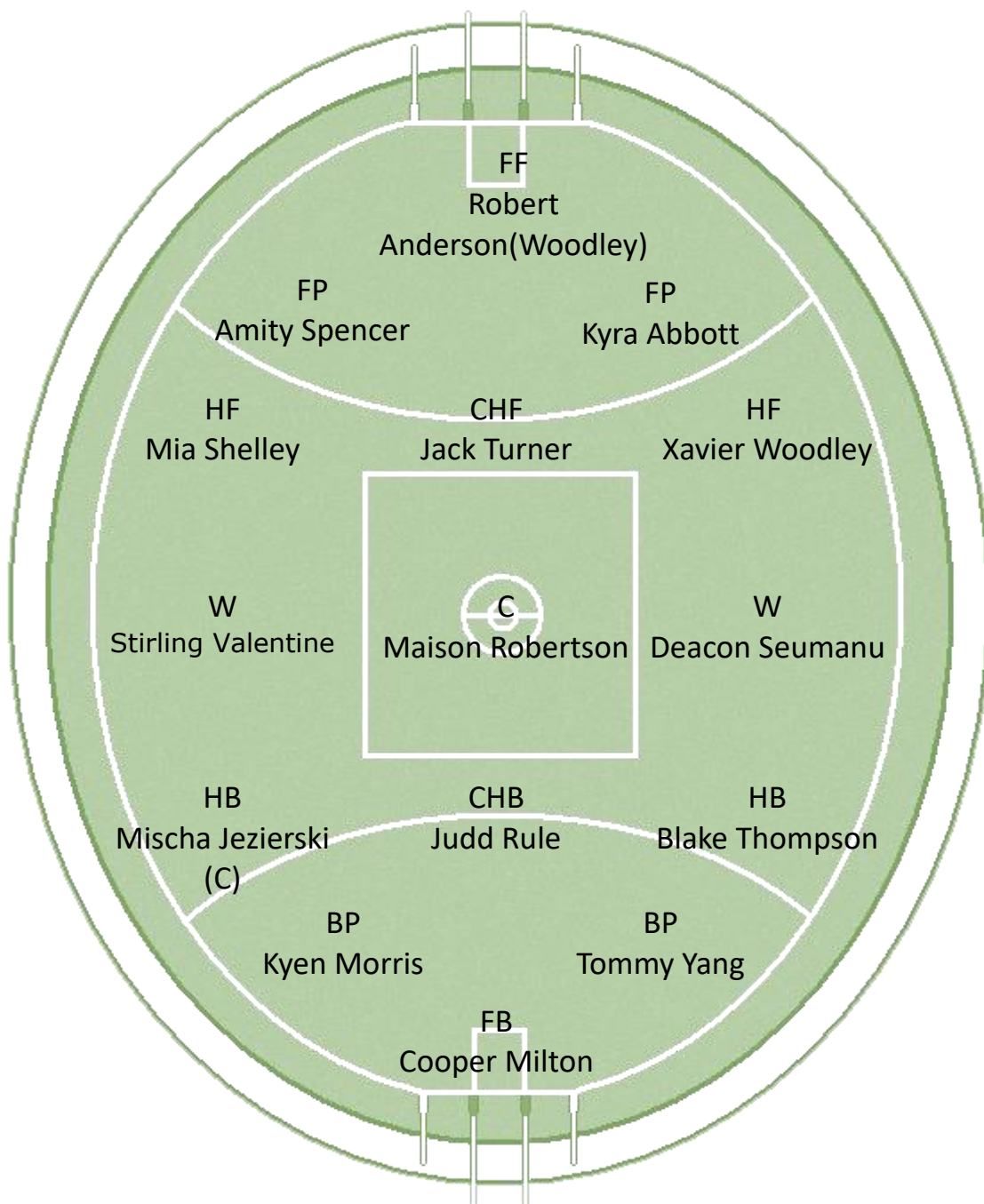
